

Daniel Grant is an Associate Professor at West Virginia University's Department of Orthopaedics, serving as the Vice Chair of Clinical Operations and the Director of Quality and Performance Improvement. He specializes in pediatric orthopaedic surgery. In addition to his clinical and leadership responsibilities, he is an active participant in resident education and clinical research.

He earned his undergraduate degree from the University of Tennessee before obtaining his Doctor of Medicine degree from East Tennessee State University's James H. Quillen College of Medicine in 2008.
