

Kali Tileston, MD is an Associate Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery in the Division of Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgery at Stanford University. She also serves as medical director of the Stanford Children's outpatient clinics and medical director of pediatric orthopaedic surgery at California Pacific Medical Center in San Francisco. She obtained her medical degree from the University of Southern California and completed her residency and pediatric orthopaedic fellowship at Stanford University. At Stanford Children's Health, Dr. Tileston is the chair of the orthopaedic surgery Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement program and serves a faculty senator. In service to our national organizations, she acts as chair of the POSNA Pediatric Safe Surgery Program, ex-officio chair of the Advocacy committee, advocacy chair of the the AAP Section on Orthopaedics, and is an elected member of the POSNA membership committee. She also serves on the editorial board of JPOSNA and was a participant of the AOA APEX Leadership program. Her clinical practice focuses mainly on spinal deformity and trauma while her research interests center on the psychosocial aspects of scoliosis care, specifically how health mindset effects treatment compliance and postoperative recovery.
