Dr. Kristoff Reid earned his bachelor of science degree from the United States Military Academy, West Point, and, following 5 years as an infantry officer in the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division, his medical doctorate from Washington University in St. Louis School of Medicine. After residency at The Johns Hopkins Hospital, he underwent fellowship training in Orthopaedic Trauma at Duke before taking a job at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC), where he remains today.
