

Colonel Dustin Lybeck is the Program Director, Orthopedic Surgery Residency, San Antonio Uniformed Services Health Education Consortium (SAUSHEC), and the Chief of Orthopedic Oncology, Brooke Army Medical Center, Joint Base San Antonio, Texas. He supervises the training of 30 residents and 24 faculty, providing Level 1 trauma care and 12,000 surgeries per year to area beneficiaries. Colonel Lybeck grew up in Iowa and graduated from the US Air Force Academy with a degree in biology. He completed medical school at the University of Iowa College of Medicine in 2005. He completed a civilian internship at Riverside Regional Medical Center in Newport News, VA and served as the flight surgeon for the 71<sup>st</sup> Fighter Squadron, Langley AFB. He completed residency from 2008-2013 at SAUSHEC. Col Lybeck then served as an Orthopedic Surgeon on a Special Operations Surgical Team (SOST) in the 720<sup>th</sup> OSS, 1<sup>st</sup> SO Wing, Hurlburt Field, FL and deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. He then completed a fellowship in Musculoskeletal Oncology at the University of Florida from 2015-2016. He returned to Brooke Army Medical Center as teaching faculty in Aug 2016 and deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Freedom's Sentinel. He was promoted to Associate Program Director in 2018 and to Program Director in 2022. His clinical interests include bone and soft tissue sarcoma, amputee care, joint arthroplasty, limb salvage, and osseointegration.
