

Dustin Greenhill received his undergraduate degree in mathematics from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point where he was an NCAA Division 1 All-American. He was awarded the Bronze Star medal and Combat Action Badge for performance in U.S. Army leadership roles during two combat deployments to Iraq as an officer with the 101st Airborne and 4th Infantry Divisions. He then completed medical school and residency training at Temple University in Philadelphia, followed by a pediatric orthopaedic surgery fellowship at Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas, Texas. He returned to Pennsylvania and has worked at level 1 adult and pediatric trauma centers while contributing to the Scoliosis Research Society, AOA, AAOS, POSNA, and his home-based institution and medical school via committee work and academic research.
