Greg Erens, MD is an Associate Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine, specializing in joint replacement of the hip and knee. He joined the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at Emory in 2003 and currently serves as the Adult Reconstruction Division Director. He received his undergraduate degree in Biomedical Engineering from Duke University and his M.D. from Duke University School of Medicine. He completed his residency training in orthopaedic surgery at Harvard and further subspecialty fellowship training in Adult Reconstruction and Total Joint Arthroplasty at Harvard's Brigham and Women's Hospital.

Dr. Erens has received numerous honors including Magna Cum Laude and Phi Beta Kappa. Other recognition and awards include US News & World Report Regional Top Doctor, Atlanta Magazine's Top Doctor, Castle Connolly Top Doctor, Patients' Choice Award, Compassionate Doctor Recognition, Top 10 Neighborhood Doctor, and On-Time Doctor Award.
