

Dr. Daniel Davis is an orthopaedic surgeon specializing in shoulder and elbow surgery at the Rothman Orthopaedic Institute in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania where he is an associate professor of orthopaedic surgery at Thomas Jefferson University. Dr. Davis is the associate program director of the orthopaedic surgery residency at Thomas Jefferson.
