

Dr. Megan E. Johnson is an Associate Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at UT Southwestern and a staff pediatric orthopaedic surgeon at Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas, where she also serves as Medical Director of Ambulatory Care and Fellowship Director. She earned her medical degree from Vanderbilt University, where she was elected to Alpha Omega Alpha, and completed residency training in orthopaedic surgery at Vanderbilt University Medical Center, followed by a fellowship in pediatric orthopaedics at Texas Scottish Rite.

Dr. Johnson's clinical expertise focuses on pediatric spine surgery and complex spinal deformity, and she has published extensively in the areas of scoliosis, musculoskeletal infection, and pediatric trauma. She is an active member of numerous professional societies, including the Scoliosis Research Society, the Pediatric Orthopaedic Society of North America, and the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, where she has held leadership roles on multiple national committees.

A dedicated educator and mentor, Dr. Johnson directs fellowship training at Scottish Rite and regularly lectures nationally and internationally on pediatric spine care. She has been recognized with awards for research, teaching, and leadership, including the SRS Lori Karol Women in Spine Award and repeated recognition among D Magazine's "Best Pediatric Specialists."
