

Dr. Sean Bak is a Detroit native and orthopaedic surgeon who has served patients in Metro Detroit since 2005. He attended Wayne State University, where he played collegiate baseball before completing his medical degree with High Distinction at the Wayne State University School of Medicine and earning election to the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society. He completed orthopaedic surgery residency at Michigan State University and received Shoulder and Elbow training through the Charles S. Neer Fellowship in Shoulder and Elbow Reconstruction at Columbia University in New York City.

Dr. Bak has held numerous leadership roles within organized medicine and hospital governance. He was elected Medical Staff President of Henry Ford Providence Hospitals in Novi and Southfield in 2021 after previously serving as Chief of Orthopaedic Surgery. He has also served as President of the Detroit Academy of Orthopaedic Surgery, Chair of Orthopaedics for the St. John Providence Health System, and on the Board of the Novi Bone and Joint Surgery Center.
