

Dr. Anthony Ding is a board-certified orthopaedic surgeon at the University of California San Francisco Medical Center. He is dual fellowship-trained in orthopaedic trauma and in hand, upper extremity and microvascular surgery, with expertise in posttraumatic limb reconstruction.

Dr. Ding earned his B.S. in Biomedical Engineering and M.D. from Columbia University. He completed his orthopaedic residency training at UCSF, during which he received the Krevans Award for clinical excellence. He subsequently completed fellowships in orthopaedic traumatology at the R. Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center and in hand surgery at UC Irvine.

He joined the UCSF faculty in 2018 and currently serves as Residency Program Director. He is a UCSF Teaching Scholar and a member of the Haile T. Debas Academy of Medical Educators. His academic work centers on surgical education and mentorship as avenues for advancing equity and belonging in training.
